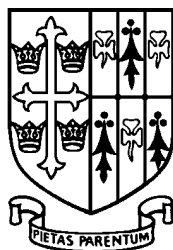

## Section A

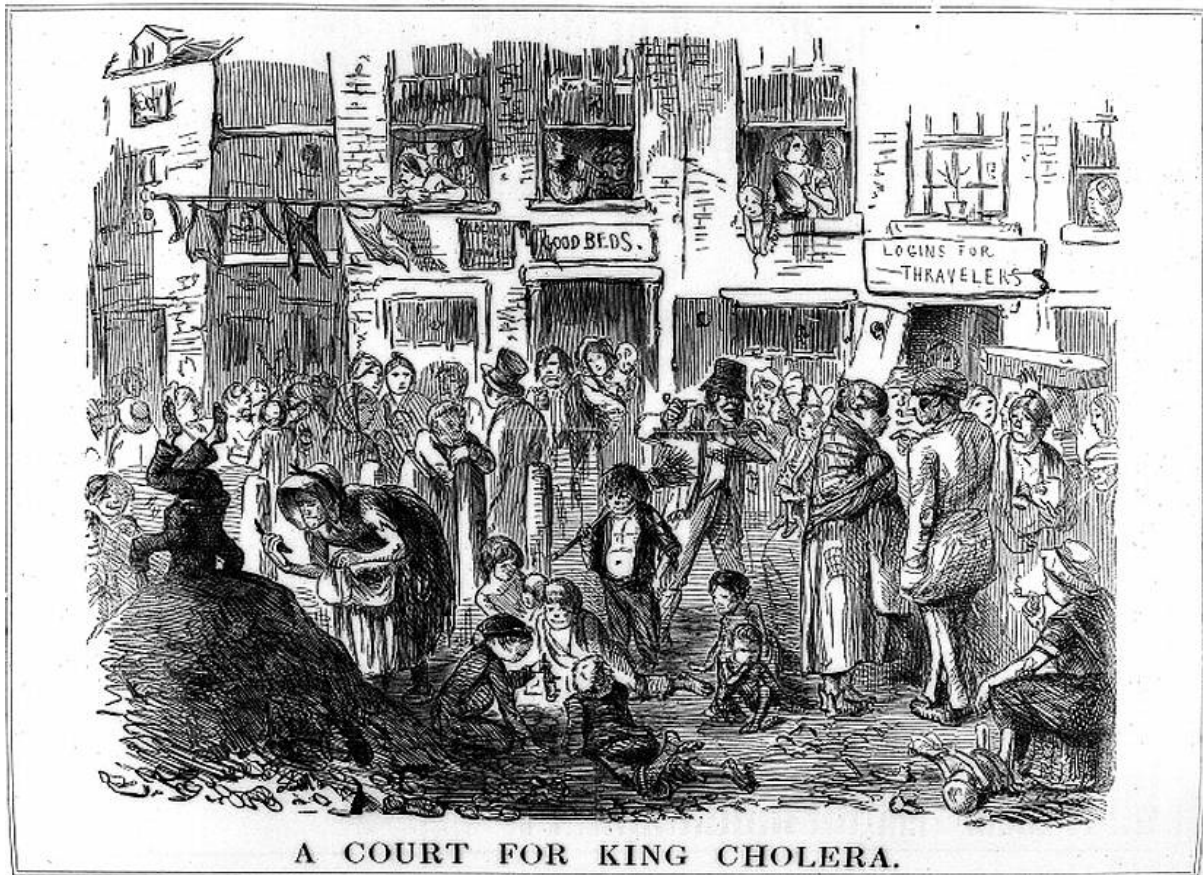
**Answer ONE question from this section.**
