




Studying Modern Languages at University

- Modern Languages courses are **increasingly undersubscribed**, so candidates stand a very good chance of being offered a place.

- Even **Oxford**, traditionally one of the hardest universities to get into, had **more places than applicants** last year.

- You don't have to study a language that you have taken at school!



- In particular, the **year abroad**, which is an integral part of almost all Modern Languages degree programmes in the UK gives students a **head start in the job market**.

- The experience of **working and studying abroad** delivers improved language abilities and greatly enhanced intercultural, problem-solving and personal skills.

- Language graduates who have spent a year abroad are **amongst the most mature, adaptable and independent people** entering the job market.

- A recent House of Lords report (July 21) noted that “on average, Erasmus students have better employability skills after a stay abroad than 70% of all students”.
- It also reported that the “unemployment rate of Erasmus students five years after graduation was 23% lower than the rate for those who had not spent time abroad.”
