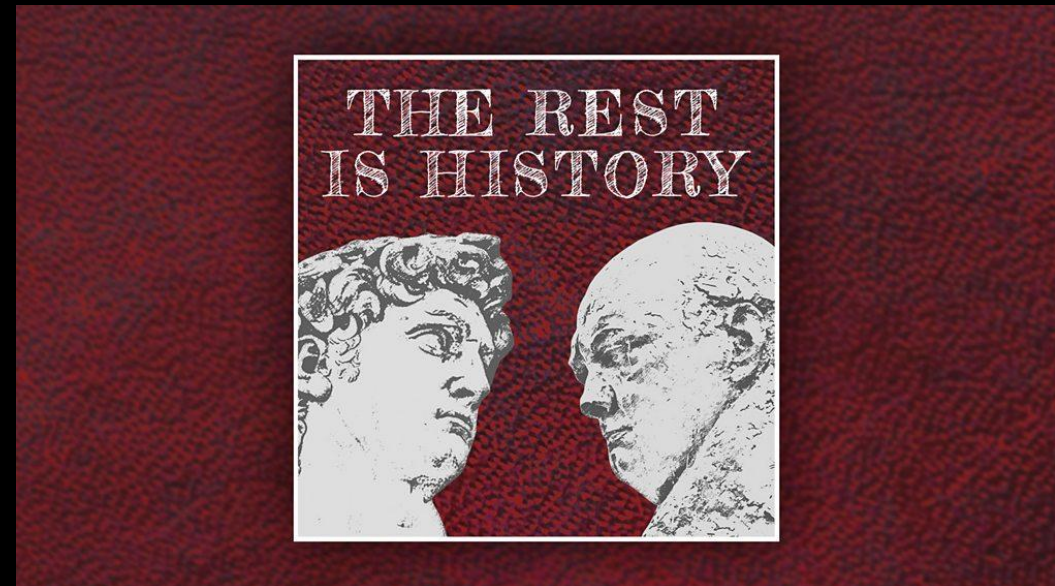
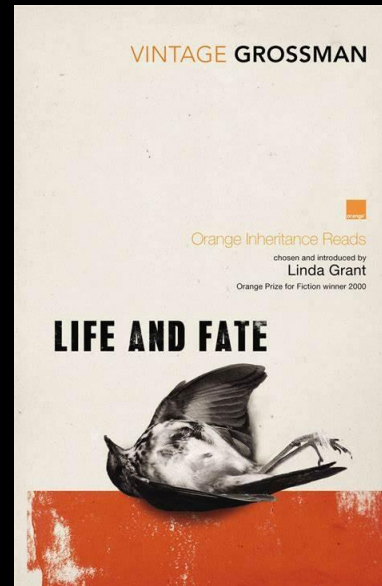
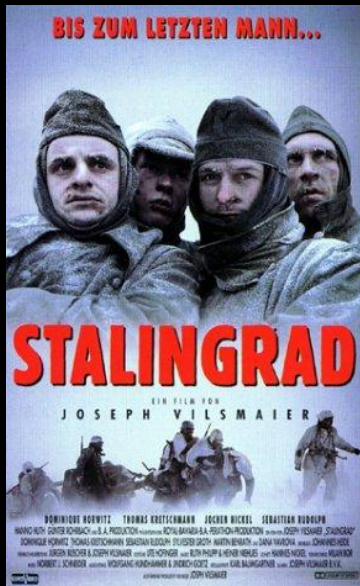


YOUR UCAS APPLICATION

- Being a 'good egg' is important
- But you need to evidence of an interest in History.
- For UCAS personal statements in 2025, the format will change to a structured set of three targeted questions:
 - **Why do you want to study this course or subject?**
Share your interest and understanding of the field.
 - **How have your qualifications and studies prepared you for this course? -**
Highlight relevant experiences and skills.
 - **What additional experiences have helped you prepare, and why are they valuable?**
Discuss any extracurricular activities or work experiences that contribute to your readiness

Make the most of your examples

- If you have an example of an essay prize entry include:

The competition name, essay title, a summation of your argument. Demonstrate your research skills and use of sources. Note any key debates you engaged with

1. **University of Aberdeen:** The University of Aberdeen may accept applicants with one A and two B grades at A-level for their history courses.
2. **University of Birmingham:** The University of Birmingham might consider applicants with one A and two B grades at A-level for admission to their history programs.
3. **University of Bristol:** The University of Bristol could accept students with one A and two B grades at A-level for their history courses.
4. **University of Dundee:** The University of Dundee may consider applicants with one A and two B grades at A-level for admission to their history programs.
5. **University of East Anglia:** The University of East Anglia might accept students with one A and two B grades at A-level for their history courses.
6. **University of Essex:** The University of Essex may accept applicants with one A and two B grades at A-level for their history programs.
